GHOST TOWN IN THE SKY HOSTS GOSPEL SUNDAYS

Maggie Valley, NC - Starting September 14, North Carolina's mountain top family theme park, Ghost Town in the Sky, will host nationally-recognized gospel groups every Sunday through October. Entertaining families since 1961, Ghost Town patrons can enjoy special guests while visiting the North Carolina landmark, which is literally built on the side of Buck Mountain in Maggie Valley.

The following performances will be offered to Ghost Town's guests for no additional cost after the price of admission:

All shows will be performed in Ghost Town's newest entertainment venue, America's Music Hall, which seats 500 people. The Timberwolf Café, also new for the 2008 season, is located within the Music Hall, which allows patrons to enjoy a meal while watching the performances.

Ghost Town is famous for its Wild-west theme, live-action shows and beautiful setting on top of Buck Mountain, which is elevated over 4000 square feet. The park is nestled at the foot of the Great Smoky Mountains and 4 miles east of the Blue Ridge Parkway's Milepost 255 in Maggie Valley. Maggie Valley is 14 miles east of Cherokee and 34 miles west of Asheville.

A day at Ghost Town starts by taking a twenty-minute chairlift ride with 75-degree inclines up the side of a mountain. The multi-level, 90-acre park features live action shows, rides, crafts and live music.

Ghost Town originally opened on June 11, 1961 and remained opened until 2002. The landmark re-opened for the first time in five years under new ownership in 2007 and has been a vacation destination for decades. To help battle the rising gas prices, Ghost Town has been offering a 20% discount for online daily admission purchases. They are also offering \$10 off 2009 Season Passes, which can be used during the remaining 2008 season.
